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UIUC Evaluators Roles & Responsibilities

- ❖ Develop and conduct an *evaluation of the SWTCIE Illinois project performance* that documents the *relationship* between participant engagement with competitive integrated employment (CIE) practices and strategies implemented by the project and key outcomes.
 - Collect data (i.e., from SWTCIE Illinois participants, Illinois Division of Rehabilitation Services (DRS), 14c grantees)
 - Obtain partner/stakeholder feedback (i.e., from other partners such as parents, families, advocates, & guardians, schools, CIE employers, state agencies, community-based agencies)
 - Analyze data collected from the project to help inform SWTCIE Illinois project refinement and implementation
 - Evaluate project and its impact (e.g., strengths and challenges) on assisting SWTCIE Illinois participants with obtaining competitive integrated employment
- Produce data and findings for the SWTCIE Illinois Website https://swtcieillinois.ahs.illinois.edu/ to be utilized by:
 - o SWTCIE Illinois participants, Illinois DRS, 14c grantees, & other partners/stakeholders
 - Illinois DRS to meet their reporting requirements to the Rehabilitation Services Administration
 - Mathematica to contribute to their national evaluation process

Data and Reporting Requirements for 14c Grantees

- UIUC evaluation team conducts formal evaluation of six 14c organizations, grantees of the SWTCIE
 Illinois project, on at least a quarterly basis
- Collect quarterly and year-end reports regarding 14c organization project performance measures via Periodic Performance Report (PPR) and (cumulative) outcomes using prescribed SWTCIE Illinois protocol
